Introduction

INTENT

The intent of our RE curriculum is to deliver high-quality lessons that inspire all pupils to understand the beliefs of others. We aim to underpin Christian values in all our lessons to inspire all children to learn, express themselves and support their ability to live with one another in harmony. We aim to deliver a cross curricular based learning model with a multi-sensory approach to teaching. We will continue to develop our great relationship with our local partners such as our linked Clergy as this deepens our children's understanding, questioning and relationships with others in our community. We want to provide opportunities to allow children to explore and question and analyse religion which will help to embed our values including faith and respect.

IMPLEMENT

We follow the Peterborough Agreed Syllabus for RE with support and guidance from the Diocese of Ely, using the scheme Understanding Christianity to support and develop teaching of Christianity.

Religious Education is at the core of everything we do and we plan our curriculum so that we can take every opportunity to view with awe, the wonders of all elements of God's world.

Christianity is taught alongside five other major world faiths and world views including Hinduism, Islam, Judaism, Buddhism, Sikhism and Humanism.

RE Education is not about trying to convert young people towards or indeed away from any particular religion. Instead, we believe that as parents and teachers we have a duty to open minds to our ever-diversifying communities with the sole aim of helping children to develop an understanding and questioning of both their own opinions, faith and values and those of others around them.

We are blessed to have many different faiths and cultures represented within our school community and are proud of the mutual respect and understanding that is evident in school every day.

IMPACT

As a school, we value the fact we have a specialist RE teacher in our school who solely teaches RE across the school. The result of this is an RE curriculum that facilitates the achievement of all our pupils in a multisensory way which allows all pupils to participate and enjoy the subject. Pupil high-interest and enthusiasm for RE as a subject is proof that the teaching and learning in the subject is excellent. Our pupils are confident and able to form their own opinions, ask questions and explore their own belief systems in a supportive, accepting and open way.

Buddhism

Year 5 - Buddhism unit

When the Buddha reached enlightenment he had been meditating for six days and nights. In class, we have tried some meditating stories to discover what it might feel like to find inner peace. Some of the children found it very easy, calming and relaxing, one or two fell asleep and for others they felt uncomfortable. However, all of the children were invited to join in to see if it would help them, some children said they would like to do more at home as it felt good to relax and calm their minds.



We have been drawing representations of the Buddha. Do you know the reason why there are so many varieties of statues of Buddha? They symbolise different attributes about him and his life. See if you can spot these in the children's artwork:

One with his right hand raised? This shows he is a peacemaker.

One reaching with one hand towards the ground? This shows he is reaching for enlightenment.

One with his arms crossed? This shows his wisdom.

One holding a bowl? This shows the importance of giving to charity. It is an alms bowl.


One with a raised hand and the other in front? This shows compassion and charity.

Long dangly ears? This shows he was a rich prince or he was good at listening.

A bun on top of his head covered in snails? It is believed to show wisdom and there is a story that teaches when the Buddha was meditating snails climbed onto his head to protect him from the sun.

Can you spot anymore similarities or differences? What do you think they mean?



































































Call to Prayer for the Nation

It emphasises the need to talk to God and when we communicate with Him we will often be shown the way or offered an answer.

To support the community we have also added a 'Time to think' PowerPoint with stimulating questions, ideas and thoughts for you to talk about as a family. Please take a look. It can be a good way to spend time together thinking, talking and reflecting and can support everyone's mental wellbeing.

Christingle

"I am the light of the world" John 8:12

Every year we will hold a Christingle Service for the whole school. The Christingle Service is a celebration that brings our school family together to share the light of Jesus. The Children's Society https://www.childrenssociety.org.uk/how-you-can-help/fundraise-and-events/christingle/what-is-christingle supports schools and churches to create Christingles which help to teach children about Jesus.

In December 2020, during our Festivals of Light Enrichment Week every child in school created a Christingle and we held a socially distanced service through Zoom. This was very different to our usual Collective Worship Service, however the children still experienced the awe and wonder that comes from Christingle.



Creation 2021-22

'God looked at everything he had made, and it was very good" Genesis 1:31.

At St Michael's Church School, we use Understanding Christianity to support the teaching and learning of RE. The whole school will learn about God's Creation, from Reception learning about who God is and what He did, to Year 4 learning about the Fall of Humanity and all the way to Year 6 questioning how Genesis and Psalm 8 sits with Scientific and others viewpoints?

The majority of the school will start the year with the Creation unit except from Year 5 who will be studying the unit alongside the Science Planets and the Solar System topic after Christmas. In term one, the children will take part in 'Walk through the Bible - Old Testament' so they will learn 40 stories in the OT from Genesis to the Prophets speaking about the coming Messiah.

Our curriculum allows children to learn about God's creation through a question based learning objective and their learning and understanding is deepened the following year.

Reception: Why is the word 'God' so important to Christians?

Year One and Two: Who made the World?

Year Three and Four: What do Christians learn from the Creation Story?

Year Five and Six: Creation or Science: Conflicting or Complimentary?

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

CROPS and Walk Through The Bible

CROPS is a group of amazing people in Peterborough who provide educational and pastoral resources to schools through RE curriculum input, SMSC development and Collective Worship.

We have the incredible support from Rachel who comes into our school to deliver the 'Walk through the Bible' programme with our children, The Old Testament with Year 5 and The New Testament with Year 6.

This is a practical storytelling programme that delivers the OT and NT through 40 key stories, which is accompanied with a series of actions and pictures to support children in remembering the story titles of the Bible.

Our children love these sessions and they will take home a copy of the stories in a mini Bible appropriate to the Testament they have been learning about.

The session is always interactive, involving acting, dressing up and audience participation in the telling of the OT/NT stories.






In this unit, the children learnt about how Jesus' incarnation was good news for all people. His life, ministry and teachings is explored in the gospels. Jesus teaches what it is like to live in a relationship with God. Jesus' parables and the Greatest Commandments are explored in this unit.

Hinduism

Year 3 have been learning all about Hindus and Brahman.

The children have learnt Brahman is a universal soul and he takes on many forms that Hindus worship as Gods and Goddesses. Hindus believe there is Brahman inside everyone. Brahman is infinite. Here is one of our Y3 pupils demonstrating this teaching point to the class. The water is changed - added salt, added food colouring but it still does not change from being water.



What do Hindus believe about God?
Miss Coulson gave Boti a drink of water.
She changed its form by adding salt, the water became cloudy but it was still water. Miss Coulson then changed the form again this time adding red food colouring. The water still remained but had changed form. Hindus believe in one God, Brahman but he has many forms.







The children have been learning about the Hindu Gods and Goddess. Miss Coulson used Spirited Play to share the story of Ganesh, the God with an elephant head. We sat outside in a big circle and listened to the story, the sun was shining and the children loved the storytelling session in a different environment.

We then learnt about how Hindus worship, using murti to represent the Gods and Goddess. A child in the class then showed his friends how he worships at home as a Hindu. He showed us a mantra that his family chant during puja.



Holy Communion

Following on from the Y4 Salvation unit learning about the Last Supper and Y5 Salvation learning about Holy Communion in Church, we invited Reverend Carol to come into school and host a full Eucharist Service. We wanted the children to gain an experience of the service however due to current restrictions it would have been hard to all visit the church.

The children who have taken their Holy Communion through their own church were invited to accept the Holy Sacrement of Jesus' body and blood. All of the children were invited to accept a blessing from Reverend Carol if they wanted, many of the children took that opportunity.

The children helped to lead the prayers and they shared some beautiful words with the group, remembering to say thank you, to ask for help and forgiveness.

In reflection of the service, the children were asked what they enjoyed the most, their responses were amazing:

- "I felt like God was with me for the rest of my day"
- "I felt calmer when Reverend Carol blessed me"
- "I enjoyed the Holy Sacrement because I have it at my church and it makes me know Jesus is with me"
- "I like it when Reverend Carol blessed me. It made me feel safer"

Following this session, one little boy decided he felt he was ready to take his own Holy Communion and on the Sunday he was welcomed into St Michael's Church.

Jesus Transforming Lives in Action

Our Year 6 children went to help at the local Church Community Café in response to their learning about Jesus' transfiguration. In this unit, the children learnt about how Jesus transformed his followers' lives and continues to make an impact even 2000 years later. The children were absolutely amazing, living proof of our school vision and values. They talked to the community, helped to take orders and clean up at the end of the café. They made everyone very proud and the feedback from the community has been overly positive. In fact, some of the children have asked to go back and help the community café, either during school time or in the Summer holidays as a volunteer.












































Judaism

Our Year 2 children have been learning all about what it means to be Jewish. Did you know that Jesus was born a Jew? Our children have been learning all about someone very special to Jews - a man called Moses. A lot of the festivals and celebrations in the Jewish faith happen because of Moses. Miss Coulson has been teaching us all about Moses' stories through Spirited Play. Can you tell which stories we have been learning about?





Psalm 8 - Scripture in Art

Year 6 - How do Christians represent their thoughts and feelings about Creation?

Psalm 8 Artwork - The children listened to Psalm 8 as a song. They were asked to write down all the keywords within the Psalm. After this, using a method called Scripture in Art the children had to decide which words were most important and then create a piece of art using those keywords, putting the words into patterns, drawings or symbols.

The children's work was then pieced together to create a Psalm 8 dedication.

Some pieces were also created into a stained-glass window which reflects beautiful colour onto our RE resources area.

2 You have taught children and babies to sing praises to you. This is because of your enemies.


And so you silence your enemies and destroy those who try to get even.
